Dear Hanna.

Many thanks for responding - my email was a little intemperate, and I apologise - I had written similar comments to a couple of your predecessors. My excuse is that I spent so much of my working life trying to help provide a useful virus nomenclature that I am really sad to see it go so wrong. Unfortunately most of the people involved, since I resigned from the EC (hoping to set a good example of regular turnover), never asked the simple question: "are we making this decision to fit with the other biological taxonomies. If not why not?"

As a result we now have a virus taxonomy that superficially looks like the taxonomies of cellular organisms but is, in fact, fundamentally completely different in several important aspects, and provides little of value, but is a trap for those visitors who have knowledge of the other taxonomies.

So in your proposed discussions at EC56 you might report that a rude relic from EC1, plus a few, suggests that a good start would be to compare the present virus taxonomy with those of the cellular organisms, and try to get the discussion beyond the assertion that "Well, viruses are different".

Thank you for the voting correspondence. As in the past the ICTV voting procedure is a total charade, and a waste of your time and ours. Dear ICTV Colleague,

It is time to vote for the Taxonomic proposals approved by the ICTV Executive Committee during its annual meeting (EC55), which took place in Jena, Germany, and virtually on Zoom in August 2023.

The online voting platform is the SurveyMonkey, as we have also used previously.

Within 36 hours, you should receive a separate email from me (hanna.oksanen@helsinki.fi via SurveyMonkey) with the link to vote. Please check your spam and junk folders, in case your mailbox settings are overly vigilant. The voting system will authenticate you on the basis of your email address.

You will be able either to vote once to approve all items, or to switch to the mode where you will vote for or against each ballot question separately. There are 203 ballot questions, one for each of the 202 taxonomic proposals approved by the EC55 and one question for a General proposal: "Establish a formal procedure for taxonomic proposal (TaxoProp) withdrawal, and a location to store rejected and withdrawn TaxoProps".

The ballot questions contain only the proposal titles and unique identifiers. Attached to the email is a file listing all proposals (MSL 39 Proposal list.xlsx). The full proposals are available at https://ictv.global/ratification_proposals

Please note that for technical reasons, the SurveyMonkey Page 1 is for the "Yes to all" option. The ballot questions in the SurveyMonkey are split into three pages (Pages 2-4; Questions 2-204); please make sure that you either vote "YES to All" (Page 1), or visit all Pages 2-4. If you wish to abstain from voting on any proposal, simply do not mark Yes or No.
