When these two phages were first characterized, the host was defined as a marine bacterium of the genus *Persicivirga* (family *Flavobacteriaceae*, *Bacteroidetes* phylum). This genus contains members able to degrade complex polysaccharides, such as xylan and ulvan [4]. Subsequent research indicated that this genus is synonymous with *Nonlabens* [5]. There is no notable difference in size between the two phages. The head diameters are approximately 47 nm and tail lengths are ~90 nm. The phage particles display a prominent collar.

BLASTN, CoreGenes (Table 1) [2], progressiveMauve alignment (Fig. 2) [1], and phylogenetic analyses (Fig. 3) [3] all indicate that the proposed genus, *P12024virus*, is cohesive and distinct from other genera. On average, the genomes of this genus are 35.7 kb in length (35.7 mol% G+C), and encode 58-59 proteins and 0 tRNAs.

Fig. 1. Electron micrograph of negatively stained Nonlabens phages P12024S (left) and P12024L (right).



Fig. 2. progressiveMauve alignment [1] of the annotated genomes of members of the *P12024virus* genus – from top to bottom: Nonlabens phages P12024S and P12024L. Colored blocks indicate the regions of 1 to 1 best alignment with rearrangement breakpoints in a different random color. The degree of sequence similarity between regions is given by a similarity plot within the colored blocks with the height of the plot proportional to the average nucleotide identity (Aaron Darling, personal communication).

Phylogenetic analysis of large subunit terminase proteins of Nonlabens phage P12014-like viruses and homologous proteins from a variety of other phages constructed using "one click" at phylogeny.fr [3]. "The "One Click mode" targets users that do not wish to deal with program and parameter selection. By default, the pipeline is already set up to run and connect programs recognized for their accuracy and speed (MUSCLE for multiple alignment and PhyML for phylogeny) to reconstruct a robust phylogenetic tree from a set of sequences." It also includes the use of Gblocks to eliminate poorly aligned positions and divergent regions. "The usual bootstrapping procedure is replaced by a new confidence index that is much faster to compute. See: Anisimova M., Gascuel O. 


Figure 1: Phylogenetic tree (the branch length is proportional to the number of substitutions per site).
