Executive Committee activities:

EC43 meeting

The 43rd meeting of the EC (EC43) was held September 9-11 2011 in Sapporo, Japan in conjunction with the XVth International Congress of Virology (ICV) and was hosted by Keizo Nagasaki. All but two of the EC members (list below) attended the 2½ days meeting. The agenda included processing of taxonomic proposals, new and those under consideration; discussion of taxonomy-related issues, including EC nominations and elections (see below); EC management; continuing development of the ICTV website; and the status of ICTV Reports (see below). The following Chairs of six Subcommittees were (re-)elected for the next 3 years: Andrew Davison (Viruses of Vertebrates), Hélène Sanfacon (Viruses of Plants), Peter Krell (Viruses of Insects), Rob Lavigne (Viruses of Prokaryotes), Said Ghabriel (Viruses of Fungi), and Elliot Lefkowitz (Virus Data). The terms of John Mackenzie (Vice-President), Anne-Lise Haenni (Secretary), James Van Etten (Chair, Fungal Virus SC), Handanahal S. Savithri (Elected Member) and Curtis Suttle (Elected Member) were completed after this meeting. They were thanked for their long service and many contributions to ICTV.

In an effort to facilitate coordination between ICTV and National Center for Biotechnological Information (NCBI), the meeting hosted presentations by NCBI researchers James (Rodney) Brister and Yiming Bao. ICTV also received a request from an individual in Japan to rename the genus *Norovirus* because of the possibility of negative associations for people in Japan and elsewhere who have the

family name "Noro". ICTV consulted widely with current and past members of the *Caliciviridae* Study Group and carefully discussed the case. The position was made public at the Congress and a press release was prepared. Following this experience, the ICTV strongly encourages the media, national health authorities and the scientific community to use the virus name Norwalk virus, rather than the genus name *Norovirus*, when referring to outbreaks of the disease.

ICTV plenary meeting

During the XVth ICV, the triennial ICTV plenary meeting was held. It approved reports for the period of 2008-2011 by the President and six Subcommittee (Co-)Chairs. Three ICTV officers (President, Vice-President and Meetings Secretary), and eight members were elected for a three-year term (2011-2014) (see table below). Dr. Roger Hull (Emeritus Fellow, John Innes Centre, UK) was elected a Life Member of ICTV. Some EC members presented posters about ICTV activities that were displayed throughout the Congress.

ICTV Ninth Report

An updated online version of the Eighth Report was available for purchase from September 2010. This version of the Eighth Report served as an online resource until its replacement by the new Ninth Report.

The Ninth Report has now been published (ISBN-13: 978-0123846846). At 1327 pages, it is the largest report that ICTV has published, including 6 Orders, 87 families, 19 subfamilies, 349 genera, and 2284 species. An online version should be available before the end of 2011. The preparation of the Ninth Report was supervised by four Editors: Andrew M. Q. King (Editor-in-Chief), Michael J. Adams, Eric B. Carstens, and Elliot J. Lefkowitz, as well as ten Associate Editors: Andrew Davison, Nick Knowles, Peter Krell, Rob Lavigne, Keizo Nagasaki, David Prangishvili, Hélène Sanfaçon, Stuart Siddell, Curtis Suttle, and Jim Van Etten. ICTV is deeply grateful to the many virologists, most of them Study Group members, who contributed their expertise to the work. To improve the awareness of the community about developments in virus taxonomy, ICTV plans to update on-line version of the Report on a regular basis. Please request that your libraries purchase a copy of the Ninth Report.

ICTVdB

The ICTV database (ICTVdb) contains descriptions of many virus isolates and species. However, following the retirement of the curator, Cornelia Buchen-Osmond, the taxonomy in the database became seriously out of date. With generous support from Ian Lipkin at Columbia U (through an NIH grant) and Charlie Calisher, the software and interface have been greatly improved but the database will remain offline and unavailable until the taxonomy has been fully updated and checked. Study Group Chairs

Study Groups (SGs) are responsible for keeping up-to-date with the emergence of new viruses and proposing new species or higher taxa in their families by submitting taxonomic proposals to the appropriate Subcommittee Chairs. Following the EC43 meeting, the newly elected Subcommittee Chairs dissolved the existing SGs and have appointed new SG Chairs who will assemble respective SGs.
